Everyone knew bestselling novelist Cassandra Tipp had twice got away with murder.

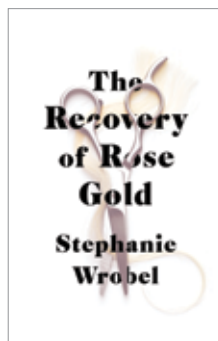
Even her family were convinced of her guilt.

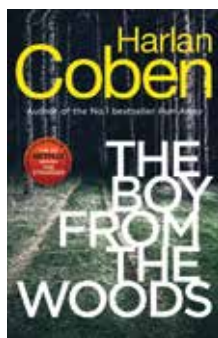

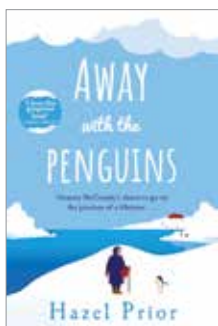

But today... today Veronica is going to make a decision that will change all of this.



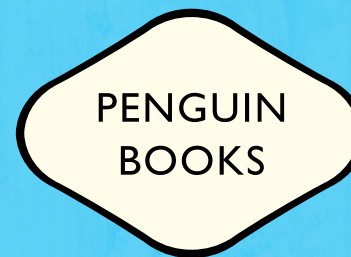

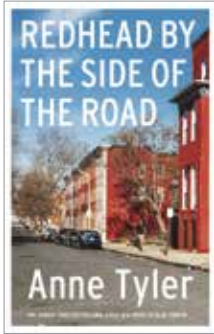

And when a teenager shows up at Micah's door claiming to be his son, Micah is confronted with another surprise he seems poorly equipped to handle.



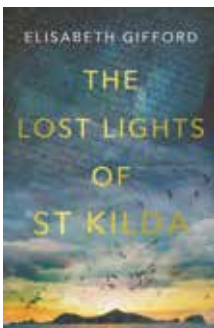

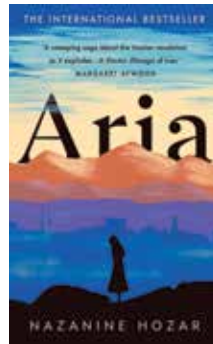
THE LOST LIGHTS OF ST KILDA

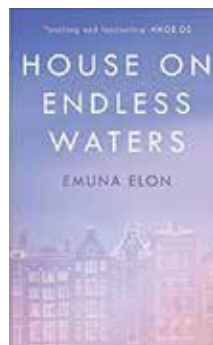

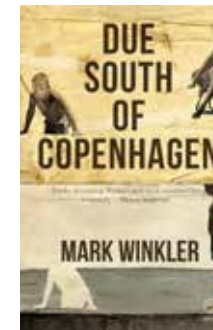
GRAVITY IS THE THING
