




























Saving the planet ONE TREE AT A TIME

A massive forest is emerging on the edge of the Sahara Desert. Thousands of people are doing their part to plant billions of seeds and grow millions of trees.


By 2030, this Great Green Wall will be 8,000km long and stretch across the entire width of Africa.

The Amazing Deep Sea Adventure



We are so excited to be publishing book 2 in the Crystal Chronicles series! Your first book was published during lockdown so we are well aware of the inspiration for *The Amazing Underground Adventure*. What inspired you to write another book in this series?

BEN: As we developed The Amazing Underground Adventure it became clear to us that we needed to continue this collaborative story into an ongoing adventure series. The introduction of the magic crystals now allows Jack, Lily and Odinn to escape to any location, any environment or even out into space at any point in time - therefore the options for adventure are endless! The moment we finished the first book we started discussing the second and living in Cape Town we felt the second book had to involve the ocean.

PADDY: Additionally, we wanted this book to continue the sense of adventure and escapism that we all, adults and children, yearn for and find fun in. *The Deep Sea Adventure* is no different, that sense of wonder, and adventure

as seen through the eyes of our heroes: Jack, Odinn and Lily, with a strong underlying narrative around having the capability and strength to protect our environment.

I'm sure *The Amazing Deep Sea Adventure* is suitable for most ages... but what age category do you believe is best?

BEN: We wrote the first book with the intention of a parent to read it to their child, but as our kids grew and began reading for themselves we realised this series would be better suited for first time readers of the age 8-10 year olds. While *The Amazing Deep Sea Adventure*



does carry with it a message of conservation we also didn't want to take ourselves too seriously and like the first book, we keep the main theme of friendship, courage and trust... as well as the odd fart joke!

How did your writing process change from book 1 to book 2, if at all?

BEN: Our process didn't really change from the first book, other than that we involved some new friends to help contribute and therefore keep the story arcs fresh. We learnt a lot from the first book and felt it was our duty to incorporate more of a message about conservation considering the subject matter and current state of our oceans.

PADDY: We also wanted to be more intentional about the main characters and their ability to work together, to overcome challenges and have fun along the way.

What is your schedule like when you're writing a book?

BEN: As Paddy and I have full-



time jobs it does make it tricky to get our heads in the right space to write, but we always find the time. If I've been busy at work, sitting down in the garden with a coffee and writing the book is a great escape - it's such fun connecting all the elements together into a continuous, freeflowing story arc while also giving hat tips to the previous stories and adventures.

PADDY: Being one with the characters and the process of editing the book allows for a sense of escapism from our "day jobs" and that enables the focus needed to deliver on the content in a meaningful and interesting manner for our readers.

The illustrations in the book are absolutely beautiful! How did you come to work with Anja Stoeckigt?

BEN: Paddy owns a kids clothing brand and met Anja when she did some t-shirt illustrations for him. We both love her style and felt the combination for our stories and her illustrations were a perfect match. Anja is such a pleasure to work with and we can really get creative constantly sending each other concepts, ideas and thoughts and she develops the illustrations and brings our vision to life.

Will there be more books in the **Crystal Chronicles series?**

BEN: Absolutely. We'll keep creating them if Penguin keeps publishing them! We've already started the third book - the kids are going time travelling!

PADDY: You betcha!

Have you always known that you wanted to be an author?

BEN: To be honest, no. I produce and write TV series and wildlife documentaries so transitioning to writing a book is not totally left field but I never thought I'd actually publish a book let alone a series!

PADDY: I too never thought I would publish a book, but I've always loved the process of creating something, being able to challenge yourself to deliver something where before there was nothing. I enjoy reading, both fiction and non-fiction, and having a co creator, co-author and friend in Ben and Anja makes the process easy to jump into.

What do you do with your time when you're not writing? Work, hobbies?

BEN: Spending time with friends and family, cooking, travelling, swimming, hiking, eating out at restaurants and I love watching TV series and films for new inspiration and ideas.

Paddy: Sport and music are a big part of my life, whether at work, watching or participating, so they are both omnipresent in my life, along with spending time with family and friends enjoying what life has to offer in that specific moment.

What is your favourite childhood book?

BEN: I loved reading Roald Dahl and Terry Pratchett as a kid and

also the books where you could choose your own adventure and jump to different pages. I guess that was some inspiration for the way in which these books are created - you never really know where the kids are going to end up next!

PADDY: Growing up they had to be the Hardy Boys books, but having a son and reading stories to him, the childrens' classics come to mind: Gruffalo, Where the Wild Things Are ("let the wild rumpus begin" must be one of the greatest lines in a children's book!), and The Velveteen Rabbit.

And lastly, for a bit of fun... As a writer, what would you choose as your mascot / avatar / spirit animal?

BEN: My spirit animal is probably a dolphin. I've always had a close connection with the sea and being underwater is my happy place. Having spent time swimming and filming dolphins over the years, their inquisitive curiosity and teamwork never fails to impress.

PADDY: I'd say my spirit animal would be an eagle, I'm fascinated by birds, and marvel at their strength, ability to glide and simultaneously have that perspective on the world.





The girl sitting beside me in the spacious reception area asks the question so brightly, with such a wide smile, that I'm positive I must have misheard her. "A favorite what?" I ask.

"Crime," she says, still smiling. Okay. Did not mishear. "In general, or- "I start cautiously.

"From the show," she says, a note of impatience creeping into her voice. Which is fair. I should have known what she meant, considering we're sitting in the middle of temporary office space for Motive.

I try to recover. "Oh, yeah, of course. Hard to pick. They're all so..." What's the right word here? "Compelling."

"I'm obsessed with the Story case," she says, and bam- she's off. I'm impressed by all the rich detail she remembers from a show that aired more than a year ago. 



I took fifteen minutes out of a very busy day to look you up."


She leans back in her chair, fingers steepled under her chin as her dark eyes bore into mine. "That's never happened before."





Baie geluk met jou wenboek – Dit het alles begin by 'n hond. Waar het die idee vir die storie vandaan gekom?

Ek het 'n paar jaar gelede deur 'n skryfdroogte gesukkel en myself aan die gang gehou met kortverhale vir tieners skryf. Daar was net een probleem - niemand wou my versameling publiseer nie! Ek het dit verstaan maar ai, my karakters het my ná aan die hart gelê. Toe hoor ek van LAPA se Jeugromankompetisie en begin wonder. In my kop was daar 'n klomp uiteenlopende tienerkarakters wat ek klaar goed geken het. Wat sou gebeur as ek 'n paar van hulle sou saamgooi? En so is hierdie verhaal gebore. Elkeen van die vier hoofkarakters is 'n samesmelting van twee of drie tieners uit my kortverhale.

'n Humoristiese karakter is makliker om te skryf, maar om 'n "ernstiger" karakter só uit te beeld dat die leser net soveel vir hom of haar omgee, is amper meer bevredigend. Sandria was my mees uitdagende karakter. Ek dink dis omdat sy 'n bietjie soos ek is... en ek verstaan myself nou nog nie aldag nie!

Hierdie storie is ook baie slim aanmekaar gesit. Hoewel dit honderd persent realisties is, is daar tog 'n piepklein magiese element. Hoekom het jy besluit om dit so te doen?

Laat ek jou 'n geheim vertel: Die magiese element in die storie is die mees realistiese deel daarvan.

Wat is vir jou die lekkerste deel van die skryfproses?

Wanneer daar genoeg teks is vir my om dit te begin redigeer eerder as kanaliseer. My eerste klompie drafts is altyd vrot en ek moet myself dwing om maar net te gaan sit en voort te ploeg. Dit raak lekker wanneer ek orde kan begin skep.

Dink jy toekennings vir boekskryf is belangrik en hoekom?

'n Toekenning is 'n groot aanmoediging. Maar ek dink die grootste waarde van 'n kompetisie is dalk dat dit mens 'n spesifieke doel en 'n sperdatum gee, sodat daai fricken storie in jou kop uiteindelik geskryf kom.

Het jy enige spesifieke skryfroetines of dalk selfs bygelowe, soos 'n spesifieke plek waar jy moet sit, of selfs 'n sekere beker waaruit jy koffie drink terwyl jy skryf?

Ek skryf net in coffee shops. Skryf is 'n eensame aktiwiteit en bietjie lig en lewe om my help baie. Asook lieflike, vriendelike mense wat vir my lekker koffie aandra.

Watse raad het jy vir voornemende skrywers, spesifiek vir mense wat aan LAPA se Jeugromankompetisie wil deelneem?

Google gerus daai wenke oor hoe om 'n suksesvolle roman te skryf. Selfs 'n flukse leser gaan nie vanselfsprekend weet hoekom 'n gunsteling-boek so 'n gunsteling is nie. En dan moet jy bereid wees om 'n vrot eerste draft (of twee, drie, ek gaan sommer deur na ses, sewe) te skryf. Daar is 'n gesegde wat lui dat daar geen goeie skryfwerk is nie, slegs goeie herskryfwerk. In my geval is dit 100% waar.

Watter boek (fiksie, kinder- en jeug, niefiksie, maak nie saak nie) wens jy jy het geskryf en hoekom?

The Book Thief. Dis die enigste boek waaroor ek nog presies kan onthou hoe ek gevoel het nadat ek dit klaar gelees het. 






Reader reviews
